

### **December 17th Plate Collection**

C.A.M.P. Youth Development Program in Paterson will be the recipient of the December Social Justice Plate Collection. C.A.M.P is located only 10 miles from Ridgewood in a completely different world. Paterson's Northside has been, and continues to be, a story of poverty, disinvestment, flooding, and robberies. The children served at C.A.M.P. range in age from 3 to 14 and are as delightful as any children that you know, but they lack the resources to compete with kids in more affluent communities. Their experiences do not include weekend soccer, ballet lessons, computers, tutors, overnight camp, SAT prep because they live at or below the poverty line. C.A.M.P. cannot eliminate the social inequities, but it does provide a safe environment with books and toys for the preschoolers who did not find room in the public preschool. It gives elementary age children and middle school kids the opportunity to be together after school in a supervised setting, to finish their homework and receive a free meal. The summer program expands their horizons with fieldtrips, work in a community garden, and swimming lessons at Graydon Pool. The building, the staff, the special experiences take money and USR has been a primary supporter of this struggling non-profit. This year C.A.M.P. plans to use our contribution to update the game room. Please give generously.

#### First Friends Needs Our Support — Stamp Out Despair Campaign

On Sunday, **December 3rd**, we will have a table in Fellowship, after the service, which will be used to write a note within a greeting card or note card to immigrant detainees held at Hudson County Correction Center. Many detainees come from other states and do not have family visiting. Congregants and children are welcomed to the table. If you have any holiday cards or note cards you don't want please bring them.

Not ten miles from the Statue of Liberty there are hundreds of immigrants languishing in "detention". They have no access to the outside: they live in a miserable windowless warehouse. They are not permitted to have possessions or even their own clothes. One of their only pleasures is corresponding with family and friends. The problem is they can only use pre-stamped envelopes, they purchase from the detention center commissary for much more than the price you can purchase them at the post office. Many detainees have little or no money so it is difficult for them to afford the postage.

We also ask you to donate:

- 1. Size # 10 envelopes with Forever Postage stamps Bring to USR and put them in the container on the porch or to the service next week or the week after.


